In September 2016, The National Digital Initiatives team hosted an event at the Library of Congress to highlight new ways to connect with digital collections. We invited programmers, artists, entrepreneurs, activists, researchers and librarians to share best practices and lessons learned in exploring collections as data during a public conference and brainstorming session with staff.

From tracking the popularity of bible verses in historic newspapers to mapping everywhere you've ever walked on your smartphone, speakers discussed the methods, skills, ethical considerations and community participation necessary to find new meaning in digitized and born digital cultural heritage collections.



WHAT WE'RE DOING

HOW #ASDATA IS SHAPING OUR WORK



We're providing ways to help librarians skill up on research computing for reference and collections management, including hosting a Software Carpentry Workshop here at the Library for area professionals.

HACKATHONS

We partnered with Archives Unleashed to host the Library's first hackathon. We will hold another this year in partnership with local universities to teach data cleaning, geocoding, and text mining to students, faculty and Library staff.

INNOVATION FELLOWSHIPS

Our first innovation fellowship was awarded to Library developers Tong Wang and Chris Adams, who worked on the labs.loc.gov concept and designed a crowsdsourcing application with Scrib'd for our historic newspaper collection. We are launching an additional fellowship program this year, and are looking for interested data artists, journalists and storytellers.

JOHN L. KLUGE LAB PILOT

We're working with the Kluge Center at the Library of Congress to support visiting fellows interested in computationally supported research. See Dan Chudnov and Michelle Gallinger's report on page 3 for more details about our plans for a Library of Congress Lab.

LABS.LOC.GOV

We're launching a labs website to serve as a sandbox for play. We'll host downloadable data sets, applications, reports, educational videos and projects from fellowships and challenge winners.
