

Weaknesses	 Current offerings cover only a portion of the scope and the need Train-the-trainer programs are not in production yet Current offerings have not reached/cannot reach critical mass of participants 	
Opportunities	 Social technologies are making outreach easier Web-based technologies are making online education options more feasible Collaborative technologies will make instruction teams more productive 	
Threats	 That training providers from outside the community will jump in and confuse That the economy will make it more difficult for hosts, instructors, participants That emergencies will continue to occur without a sufficient base in place
